Role of the Parish Council and how we can help

As we have just completed the Parish Council elections it seemed like a good time to explain what we do and areas where we can help.

The Parish Council is made up of 8 elected un- paid members who live in Fincham and represent the village on various matters. It comments on all planning is the third tier of local government, the other two being the County Council and the Borough Council.

We usually meet on the fourth Wednesday of every other month at 7.30 pm in the Memorial Hall. Our next meeting is on 24th July. We discuss a variety of issues which affect the community. The agenda for each meeting is published about a week before the meeting and is available on our website and notice board at the Memorial Hall. The public is very welcome to attend, and are encouraged to comment during the open session every meeting. If you would like to raise an issue to be included in the agenda for a meeting then please contact the Parish Clerk on the details shown overleaf.

We are responsible for the following:

- providing some of the general maintenance in the village
- the nature reserve
- the allotments
- village sign maintenance
- footpath boards and notice boards
- seats on the village green and in the churchyard

- village gateways -
- street lighting -
- litter bins
- dog waste bin
- vehicle activated speed sian
- speed activated messaging sign

The Council makes applications and although the Borough Council of King's Lynn & West Norfolk make the final decision they take the Parish Council's views into account.

The Council regularly discusses local issues such as the condition of local roads and footpaths, knowing that this is an area of concern for residents.

We are aware that speeding motorists are a big issue in the village and that is why we purchased the Speed Activated Messaging equipment (SAM2), Vehicle Activated Speed Sign and Village Gateways. We regularly report back to residents on the information gathered by the SAM2 monitor. The Parish Council was instrumental in setting up the Community Speed Watch Scheme which is run by volunteers, three of them are Parish Councillors. The scheme only started a few months ago but already we are receiving comments that it is making a difference.

We also know that many of you like to take walks around the village. We are very lucky to have a number of Public Right of Way footpaths within the village and surrounding ar-

ea and we pay a contractor to cut some of the footpaths across the fields so that access is maintained. Details of the Circular Walk are still available on our website if you are interested in taking this route. We have just arranged for an additional cut this year.

The Council works with other principal authorities and can report issues such as flooding, planning concerns, overgrown trees, footpaths, drainage, roads, street signage, and speeding to the relevant authority behalf of residents. on residents However, are also able to report these issues themselves and details of how to do this are shown overleaf.

We are governed by regulations and policies which set out how Parish Councils must operate and you will find details of these on our website. Unfortunately there are some things which we are unable to deal with, but we always inform residents of the situation if they get in touch about issues outside our control.

We try to keep residents informed of what is going on in the village in our quarterly newsletter, which is delivered to every household. Our Parish Council website has details of our activities and how to contact us.
