#### **Community Speed Watch Scheme**

#### ALLOTMENT PLOTS TO LET

We currently have several vacant plots at our allotment site on Marham Road. Each plot costs £21 per annum and is approximately 150 square yards but half plots are also available. Water is on site. Please contact the Clerk on the details overleaf if you would like a plot. The Parish Council still believes that it would help to reduce speeding if we had a Community Speed Watch Scheme for the village. We need a minimum of six volunteers to start the scheme and so far we have five residents who have volunteered. Ideally it would be good to have more than six, but we need at least one more volunteer to start.

Volunteers are trained to use speed guns, one acts as the coordinator

and is the point of contact. The group are issued with a speed radar gun, two Community Speed Watch signs and reflective jackets. Volunteers then carry out speed checks in 30mph limits working to Norfolk Constabulary's Community Speed Watch guidelines.

Returns are completed logging various details such as vehicle registration mark, make, model or colour. These are then sent into the Safety Camera Partnership team. Registered keepers, whose vehicles are observed breaking the speed limit, will have their details recorded and receive a warning letter requesting them to keep their speed down. Those who persistently offend, and live in Norfolk, will be notified to the local Norfolk Engagement Officer for Police action.

### Speed Activated Messaging (SAM2) sign

Cllr. O'Brien produced a report at the last Parish Council meeting to provide feedback on the data collected by the SAM2 sign during it's period installed opposite the Memorial Hall and near the Church.

The data recorded shows an average of just under 6000, to slightly over 7500, vehicles travelling along the A1122 every day. The volume of traffic shows peak times of between 7-9am from the west and 5-7pm from the east; there are fewer vehicles over the weekend. as could be expected. Between 5.53%

and 8.05% of vehicles were travelling above 35mph.

During the time the sign was placed in the layby opposite the Hall their were two occasions where there were temporary traffic lights, which would have affected recorded the speeds; and whilst the sign was in the layby near the Church it was the Christmas period and therefore there may well have been less people travelling to and from work and school.
