SPEEDWATCH & SAM2

Best efforts of the Community Speedwatch Team continue despite being desperately short of volunteers. Please contact the Clerk if you can help or would like to know more about becoming a volunteer.

In the last two month period 26 vehicles were recorded travelling over the speed limit with the worst offender on Marham Road travelling 48 mph in a 30 zone.

The SAM2 was in Marham Hill for six weeks & 13,708 vehicle speeds were recorded, 7.2% of which were travelling at 35 mph or above. A total of 18,817 vehicles were recorded travelling down the hill, 33.4% of which failed to slow down before entering the 30 zone. None were found to be travelling above 65 mph.
